- ✓ Are you friends with somebody, who lives in your town/city, but comes from a different country?
- ✓ Do you know any Jewish people in your neighbourhood?
- ✓ How do all these people feel about the way they are treated by others? Have they ever been discriminated because of their origin?
- ✓ What do you think are the major problems? And the reasons? And possible solutions?



**POWER ON**

Talk to you friends in your girl guide/scout group and put together a small film crew. You may need a screenwriter, a director, one or two camera operators and of course – the actors. Make a short video concerning **racism, xenophobia or anti-Semitism**. You can involve also other people, who have an experience with these kind of problems.



## FORWARD

your video to WAGGGS and let us use it for campaigning against **racism, xenophobia and anti-Semitism**. Not only will you help advocate for a good cause, but you and your friends can become international film stars. And you can also win a prize - prizes will be awarded for three best videos.



## HOLD ON

Before you start being creative, you need to know the TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- The competition is open to members of WAGGGS in the EU Member States.
- The participants should be 14 – 22 years old. If you are under 18, then you should get the approval of your parents/carers first.
- Entries can be submitted by individuals or groups not bigger than 10 people.
- There is no limit of entries per Member Organisation.
- The video
  - o should not be longer than 5 minutes.
  - o should be in English or if in any other language, English subtitles should be provided.
  - o must not violate any copyright, human rights or legislation
  - o should be submitted in any commonly-recognized video format with good quality format and sent by e-mail to [katarina@europe.wagggsworld.org](mailto:katarina@europe.wagggsworld.org) with a completed application form and on CD, DVD, or USB flash drive to WAGGGS Video Competition, Europe Office WAGGGS, Avenue de la Porte de Hal 38, Boite 1, B1060, Brussels, Belgium
  - o must not contain unsuitable language, activity, behaviour or violence
  - o the closing date for the competition is **16 May 2010**

By entering the competition you entitle WAGGGS to use the videos for any and all purposes in line with its activities.



## AWARDS

After closing the competition our jury will select three best videos and their authors will be awarded small prizes:

- 1<sup>st</sup> prize – a special Europe Region WAGGGS tee-shirt for each member of the group
- Runners up will receive a prize from a selection of WAGGGS centenary merchandize

on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2010.
